Coordinator's Report

Hello again everyone. Thank you to all those women who attended IWD celebrations at Roma Street parklands, most of whom had travelled quite some distance to get there. Representatives from all branches attended except obviously Mackay.

We are planning another (smaller) gathering at a lovely old historic house Meigunyah at Bowen Hills which houses an interesting museum and is headquarters for the Queensland Women's Historical Association. For something different a Saturday afternoon has been chosen, Saturday 12th June arriving at 1.45 p.m. for a 2.00 p.m. start. A light afternoon tea will be served and a tour of the museum and lovely old house is included. Cost per person is \$20.00. For those arriving by train, arrangements can be made to collect attendees from the Bowen Hills station nearby. Due to COVID, numbers will be capped at 20 so please let your Convenor or the office know by phone or email to admin@ownqld.org.au if you wish to attend. A waiting list will be kept, if more than 20 wish to attend.

OWNQ is very proud of Mackay and Gympie branches marking the 25th anniversary of their branches. This is a real achievement and our thanks to everyone who's played apart in reaching this milestone.

On Monday March 15th women across Australia rallied at the March 4 Justice protests which gave voice to women who demand an end to gendered violence in Parliament House and everywhere else, including domestic and family abuse. It was pleasing to see that some men also came out to show their support – husbands, fathers, brothers, friends etc to show that they too are

no longer willing to stand by as other men abuse or exploit girls and women of any age.

We were invited to take part in an awareness campaign to stop the unacceptable incidence of sexual assault of older women in aged care. The Aged Care Royal Commission was told there are around 50 sexual assaults a week of residents nationally, most of these would be women. Our branches are being invited to participate by sending a prepared letter to their government representatives, locally, state and federally.

The Housing Interest Group continues to meet via Zoom with QShelter to discuss housing vulnerability issues and is participating in activities associated with QShelter to set up an information service to assist older women in need. Any of our members are welcome to join this group, contact Di 0411 099 848.

We are very pleased to welcome some new branches into our family. Di Hill has been very instrumental in helping to establish a branch at Wynnum-Manly. June Donnelly has started a branch at Morayfield and discussions are underway regarding a possible new branch which will meet at the Atrium, Lutwyche.

Mitchelton branch instigated a great idea to produce OWNQ bookmarks to promote branches at local libraries. These look brilliant and are an excellent co-resource with our updated jazzy new brochures.

We are delighted new members continue to join and after COVID lockdowns, we are growing again.



A Connection to the Past

In February we had a wonderful surprise visit from one of our life members, Carole Cragg who was the President of OWNQ in 2000-2002. She had some historical documents belonging to OWNQ which she wanted to ensure were returned to their original home here at the office. I hadn't seen or met Carol before but she just rang one day and then turned up, and what a treat it was to meet her, she is indeed a very colourful personality.

Carol was involved in all sorts of activities and projects during her time at OWNQ, including helping to set up Qld Women's Health Network, providing research assistance with a study of urinary incontinence; was part of OWNWrite which produced a book "Surprises: Older Women Writing"; wrote a letter to State and Federal Government MPS about Valuing Community Consultation". Carol also ran a discussion group for OWN members, which met in Mary St Brisbane

once a month to discuss a range of issues. She recounted one of those discussions was about how to change the use of gender words such as everyone being referred to as "he", and a psychology academic she knew who deliberately referred to everyone as "she", unless specifically male. Still a topical point today as we go to print!



She attended our IWD at Roma Street Parklands recently and was warmly greeted by some of our long-term members who knew her back in 2000. A peep into the mettle of this remarkable woman is that she came to the gathering on her own on the very first day she was using a new walker.

We are delighted she has reconnected with OWNQ. Another insight into her cheeky sense of humour is evident in her short story below, called *Checkmate!*
