Miegunyah House is a historic house and museum in Bowen Hills which is owned and managed by The Queensland Women's Historical Society. The House was built around 1886 and it is a wonderful display of the way people lived in those days.

What does the OWNQ Management Committee do?

The Older Women's Network Queensland Inc. is an incorporated body, receiving funds from the Queensland Government to assist with the running of the organisation. The Management Team is a group of members who make the decisions on the running of the organisation including financial management, employing and managing staff, and working to the rules of the Queensland Office of Fair Trading and our Constitution and OWNQ rules/policies.

Currently, the MC consists of Di Hill (President) Lisa Signorini (Secretary) Rosemerry Paidley (Treasurer) and Lee Hodgson, June Donnelly, Deb Brown, Ruth McLean and Marianne Wright, and meets monthly (often via an online program called Zoom).

The Management Committee is elected at an Annual General Meeting each year (probably in November 2024 this year), and we welcome new members – so if you have skills that you feel would benefit the organisation – please consider nominating yourself or someone from your branch to help us continue to make progress with the organisation that is so helpful to senior women in Queensland.

This year, we have some major challenges, from changing our Constitution (maybe in June to comply with new Office of Fair Trading Qld rules), running a National Conference in Queensland (which you will hear more about soon – but likely to be in October), and our AGM (which is often in October, but due to the Conference may be in November.) You will receive updates on these events shortly.
